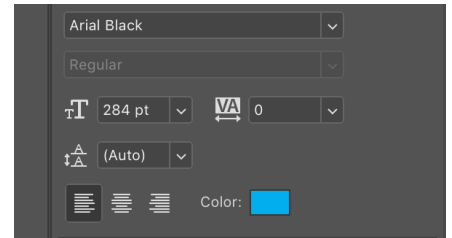


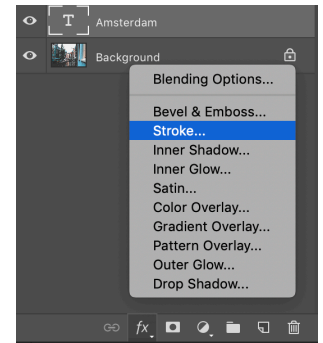
Photoshop 4 Layer Styles

Adding Strokes to Type

Using the text tool create a text box. With the text highlighted, click and drag the **tT** to increase the size of your text so you can see what you're working with. Choose a color for your font.

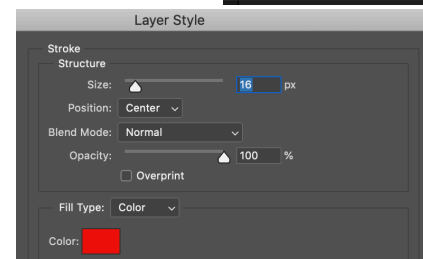


Then, select text **Layer**, and click on the **fx** button and select stroke.



When layer style window opens, grab and drag the little gray house to the stroke width of your choice.

You can also use the **Position** drop down to put the stroke inside, outside or center.

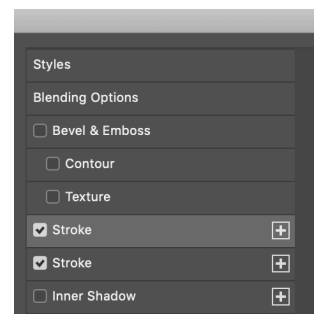


Change the stroke color to one that works for you and click OK.

Double Strokes

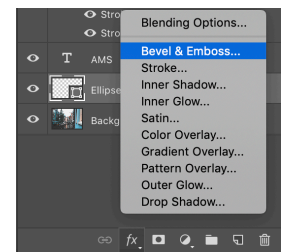
Double click on your text layer.

In the **Layer Style** box, click on the **+** in the **Stroke** row to add another stroke. Select a color for your stroke and drag the small white house to the width you want for your second stroke.

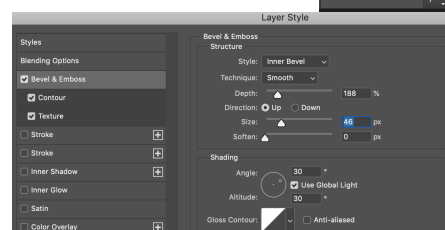


Bevel and Emboss

Add a shape to your artboard if you do not already have one. With shape **Layer** selected, click on **fx** and select **Bevel & Emboss** from the menu.



In the **Layer Style** window, experiment with the settings to find an effect that works for you.



Drop Shadows

Select the layer you want to add a shadow to in the **Layers** panel. Then click **fx** and select **drop shadows** from the menu.

Play with the settings in the **Layer Style** window to achieve the result you want.
